Who is the Yarnbomber?

Stephen Duneier is an avid outdoorsman, logging well over 1,000 miles a year in the mountains of Santa Barbara, California. He hikes, bikes, runs, unicycles, barefoots and even uses jumping stilts to traverse the trails.

What is a Yarnbomb?

A yarnbomb is simply an art installation with yarn as the medium. The “Whoas!”, “Wows!” and smiles that instinctively interrupt deep conversations and exhaustive panting as hikers turn the corner and see them for the first time, serve as evidence of the power of his installations.
